



Play the fish *quickly*, look for a suitable area to land fish to minimise damage to the fish.



If using a landing net, use one with <u>knotless rubber</u> mesh. Always have <u>forceps</u> or <u>equipment</u> to hand before you start fishing to aid you when releasing a fish.

If water temperature rises <u>above 18°C</u> you should <u>stop</u> fishing. Warm water holds less oxygen and fish become <u>stressed more easily</u>. During very warm weather fish in the <u>early morning</u> before the river heats up.



Keep the fish in the water <u>at all times</u>, even if you want a very quick photograph. If possible do <u>NOT</u> lift the fish out of the water to photograph.

Do <u>NOT</u> take the fish out of the water and place it on the river bank.



If the fish is deeply hooked <u>cut the line</u> and <u>release it</u>. The fish will eject the hook and recover on its own.

Try releasing the fish <u>without</u> touching it by pulling the line in and unhooking the fish while still in the water, <u>or</u> if using a landing net <u>lower</u> the net into the water and let the fish <u>swim out</u>.
